Fund Objective

The Fund seeks to provide consistent income* by investing in Shariah-compliant equities with attractive dividend** yield and/or potential dividend yield.

**Note: "Attractive dividend" refers to stocks of companies which have provided an average gross dividend of at least 3% for the past 3 years from the latest financial year.

Market Review

FBM KLCI and FBM Shariah Index ended the month marginally higher at +0.72% and +0.84% respectively as Malaysia began easing lockdown measures and started to roll out vaccination program. All sectors (except healthcare) were broadly higher led by energy as oil prices trended higher. Commodities had a particularly good month with CPO up by 7.22% to RM3,742 and crude oil gained 18.34% to end at USD66.1 per barrel, the highest level since January 2020 as US production has taken a hit from freezing storms. Retailers remained as net buyers at RM2.0bn (vs RM1.8bn in January) whilst local institutions were net sellers at RM1.7bn. Foreign institutions remained net sellers at RM0.9bn. Ringgit was slightly weaker by 0.24% to RM4.05 against USD at the end of February 2021.

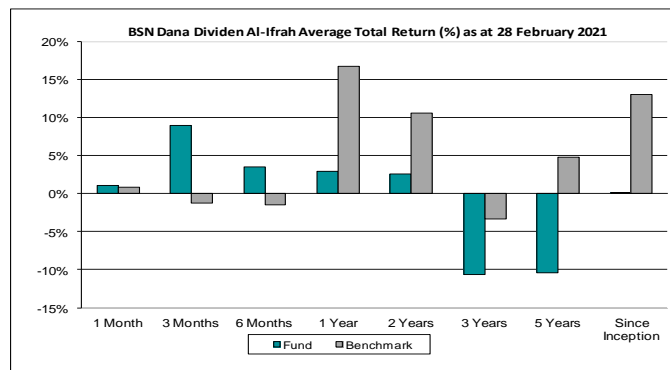

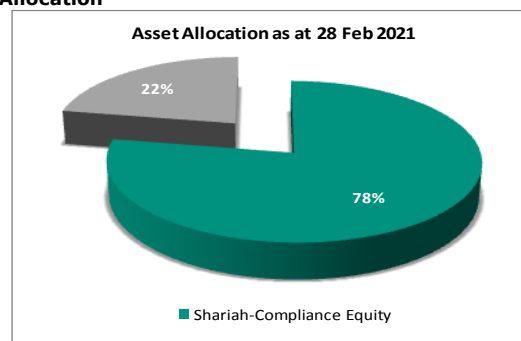
