## Fund Objective

\*\*Note: "Attractive dividend" refers to stocks of companies which have provided an average gross dividend of at least 3% for the past 3 years from the latest financial year.

## Market Review

FBM KLCI and FBM Shariah fell 1.3% and 2.0% respectively in September driven by profit-taking in the glove stocks, concerns over political uncertainty and the end of loan moratorium. Bank Negara Malaysia maintained the Overnight Policy Rate at 1.75%, in view of signs of economic recovery. The World Bank revised its 2020 economic growth forecast for Malaysia to a contraction of 4.9% from the previous 3.1% decline following the country's sharper-than-expected GDP contraction in the second quarter of 2020. The Prime Minister declared a new economic stimulus package worth RM10bn or 0.7% of GDP, bringing the cumulative Covid-19 stimulus measures to RM305bn or 21.5% of GDP. Malaysia was kept in the FTSE World Government Bond Index but will remain in the watch list for a potential downgrade. Ringgit was flat in September, hovered at RM4.16 against USD. Brent crude fell by 9.6% after four months of successive gains amid growing concerns that another wave of the coronavirus pandemic will spark tighter lockdown measures and further suppress crude demand.

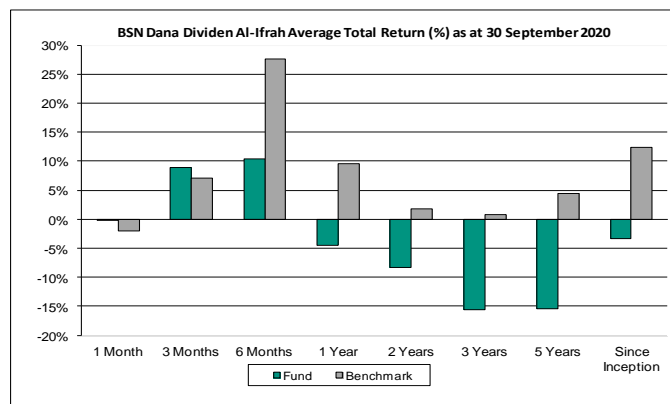

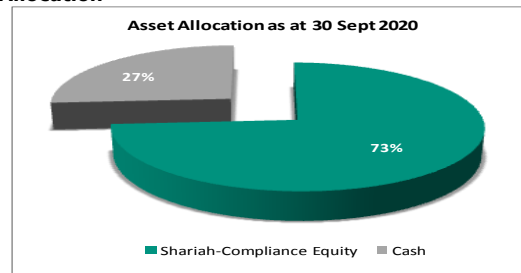
